To apply phonic knowledge and skills as the route to decode words. To blend sounds in unfamiliar wordsusing the GPCs that they have been taught. To respond speedily, giving the correctsound to graphemes for all of the 40+ phonemes. To read words containing taught GPCs. To read words containing -s, -es, -ing, -ed and -est endings. To read words with contractions, e.g. I'm, I'll and we'll.	To read Y1 common exception words, noting unusual correspondences between spelling and sound and wherethese occur in words.	To accurately read texts that are consistent with their developing phonic knowledge, that do not require them to use other strategies to work out words. To reread texts to build up fluency and confidence in word reading.
