It is important to follow the rules and laws. There are consequences for people who break them.



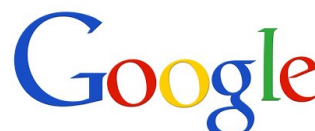
The internet can be used for lots of different reasons; for school, work or leisure.

We use search engines to find out information. It is important to make safe, reliable choices when we can choose from the search results.



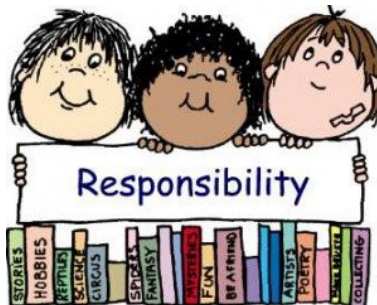
If we see things online that are concerning, worrying, unkind or inappropriate, we need to report them.

Sometimes there are stereotypes around certain jobs, but there are lots of role models that we can look up to, for example, women who are scientists.

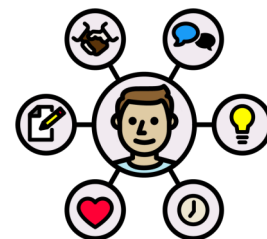
We are all entitled to certain things which protect us, these are called our human rights.
