The Geography Curriculum at Moorside is mapped out to include key aims as outlined in the National Curriculum. Our curriculum is designed to not only teach children key knowledge about the world around them, but also to give them the skills required to find out things for themselves.

For each new Geographical concept children will go through 4 stages of learning:

- Locational Knowledge: Locating cities, regions, countries or continents on a range of maps.
- Geographical skill and fieldwork: Using map skills to identify areas ad key features. Using fieldwork to observe, measure and record features using different methods.
- 3. Human and Physical Geography:
 Describing and understanding key aspects
 of physical and human geography.
- 4. Place Knowledge- Using key vocabulary they have learnt to effectively communicate about the similarities and difference of the place they have studied with other locations.

To ensure children receive a balanced Geography curriculum all year groups study Geographical topics at a local, national and international level. Throughout their school career children will learn about the key physical and human features of the UK as well as studying each continent of the world. Starting with the geography of their classrooms and school environment, each year children's local area study will slowly expand until they have a secure knowledge of where they live and how this area is an important part of the Northern region of the UK.
