

Dear Parents and Carers,

Further to more recent and updated information from central government, detailed below are the expectations from Moorside Primary regarding your child/ren accessing the provision at our school, during this period of uncertainty.

We are now insisting that only children where both parents are critical workers, are attending school. If both parents are not critical to the COVID-19 response effort, you should now have made arrangements so that the non-critical worker in your family, is able to safely keep your child/ren at home.



If you are identified as critical worker, and have no alternative way of keeping your child/ren safely at home, the following will need to be adhered to:

- Parents / Carers to remain outside the school building
- Phone ahead if you are collecting your child/ren early.
- Information to be provided detailing shift patterns and dates of when your child/ren will be attending the school provision.

As detailed in previous correspondence, you are required to provide school with documentation that identifies you as a critical worker.

You will not be permitted to leave your child/ren at school without providing this. If you are yet to provide this information to school, please ensure you have done so by the end of today (23<sup>rd</sup> March 2020). A photo via SeeSaw is sufficient.

I am sure you appreciate that our main concern is the welfare and safety of all of our pupils, families and staff. The below information is taken from government legislation:

***“Many parents working in these critical sectors will be able to ensure their child is kept at home. Every child who can be safely cared for at home should be, to limit the chance of the virus spreading.”***
