Moorside Community Primary School Sport Grant Expenditure Spending Plan



Overview

In March 2013 the Government announced that it would provide additional funding to primary schools to support the improvement of provision of PE and sport. There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- 1. To engage all pupils in regular physical activity (health and well-being).
- 2. To raise the profile of PE.
- 3. To increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4. Increasing the range of sports and activities on offer for all pupils.
- 5. To increase participation in competitive sport.

At Moorside, we use our Sport Premium to make additional and sustainable improvements to the overall quality of PE, physical activity and sport that we have on offer. We aim to build capacity and capability to ensure that improvements made will benefit pupils that join our school in future years.

Moorside total grant balance: £45,819.50

This is inclusive of the first grant instalment of £12, 367 for 22/23

A further instalment will be in addition to this in April 2023 of £8,823.


